

Grade 11 American History (CHA3U): The Road to Revolution

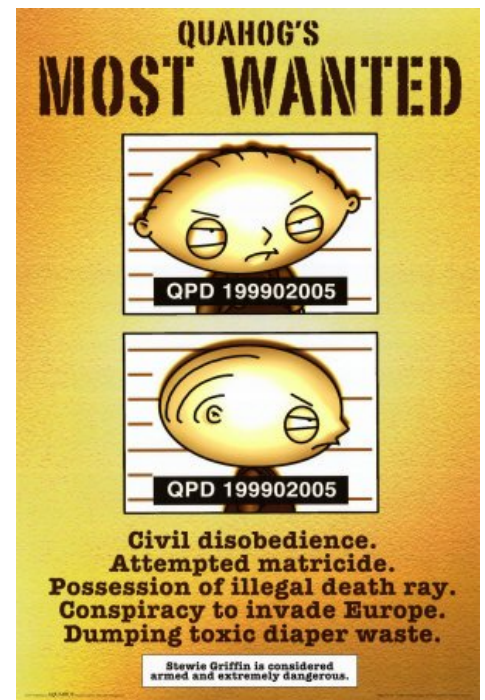
WANTED POSTER ASSIGNMENT

In the decade since the end of the French and Indian War in 1763, Britain had strengthened its direct control of the American colonies. A succession of new taxes, restrictions on west-ward expansion, and less colonial autonomy in government angered colonial leaders. The increased British military presence in the colonies did nothing to reduce tensions. Relations between Britain and its colonies was at an all-time low. The British viewed the American colonials as ungrateful, worthless traitors while colonists looked at the British with disdain and saw them as pompous, arrogant, money-grubbing meddlers.

Your task:

Create a wanted poster representing either the British Side or American Colonial Side. Your poster should follow the format of a standard wanted poster and should be seeking the help of others sympathetic to your view, to aid you in hunting down and capturing one of the individuals who represent "the other side". Your wanted poster MUST include the following information (some info may be fabricated for the purpose of the assignment, but the bulk must be rooted in fact):

- 1) Picture/Graphic Image
- 2) Full Name + any Aliases
- 3) Biographical Info (date of birth, position/job, place of birth)
- 4) Physical description (height, weight, eye/hair colour, identifying marks, clothing, etc)
- 5) Wanted for (stick to the facts!) *For this section, list what the individual has done to cause his pursuers to want him *Dead or Alive*...
- 6) Who is looking for him/her
- 7) Last Seen
- 8) Reward

Ray has been convicted of burglary, robbery, forging U. S. Postal Money Orders, armed robbery, and operating motor vehicle without owner's consent.

CAUTION

RAY IS SOUGHT IN CONNECTION WITH A MURDER WHEREIN THE VICTIM WAS SHOT. CONSIDER ARMED AND EXTREMELY DANGEROUS.

A Federal warrant was issued on April 17, 1968, at Birmingham, Alabama, charging Ray as Eric Starvo Galt with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen (Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 241). A Federal warrant was also issued on July 20, 1967, at Jefferson City, Missouri, charging Ray with Interstate Flight to Avoid Confinement for the crime of Robbery (Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 1073).
